

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Discussion

The Arizona University System recorded an increase of 847 (6.4%) in the number of Arizona high school graduates who enrolled in the Fall semester immediately following their senior year. That group totaled 13,987 in Fall 2015 and places enrollment of that group at a level that is higher than any previous year. That is a 69% increase since the 1999-2000 academic year. (See graphic below.)

The academic preparation of this class was better than previous years. Approximately 87% were admitted without academic deficiencies as compared to 84% in Fall 2014 and 80% in Fall 2011. Their first term GPAs were higher as well at 3.0 as compared to 2.9 in Fall 2010 through Fall 2015.

In first year English, the majority of students (72%) took freshman English and had an average grade of 3.3, up 0.1 from last year. Approximately 19 percent took advanced English and received an average grade of 3.4. This was unchanged from the last
